Conditions of Award

- 1) This award is aimed at the rising stars of the UK nuclear industry. It is aimed at personnel who are within the first 10 years of their nuclear career, who have already achieved success and who are seen as the future leaders of the industry, they will also display characteristics that support the Nuclear Delta® *.
- 2) The Young Professional Award will be awarded each academic year. The nomination will be completed by the Employer.
- 3) The proposed award is £250 prize money and a signed NI commemorative certificate
- 4) The Prize will be presented at the NI/NIA Nuclear Dinner on 7 December 2017, with the prize winner attending the event for free. If the prize winner should be unable to attend, the prize will be presented at your prize giving ceremony (if you do not have an awards ceremony the prize can be awarded at an agreed time) by a member of the Nuclear Institute, and the prize winner will be able to attend another NI Event for free.
- 5) Nominations for an award will be made by Employers and must be received by the Education and Training Committee no later than 31 October 2017.
- 6) Nominations must be made on using the appropriate forms and emailed to communications@nuclearinst.com

This is in addition to the general technical, quality, health, safety and environment requirements as necessary for registration and membership of other professional institutes/institutions.
