What is it?

The YGN Midlands Branch Speaking Competition is your chance to present a talk on any nuclear, energy or environmental topic, whether technical, social or personal to you. It's a broad scope and we encourage entrants from all backgrounds to enter.

Each presentation should last **10 minutes** and will be followed by **5 minutes of questions** from the judges and audience.

The winner will be entered into the National YGN Speaking Competition to compete against the other local branch YGN competition winners, which will be held later this year. There are cash prizes and the opportunity to present at the YGN annual seminar which precedes the YGN annual dinner.

Why should I enter?

The competition will give you valuable experience in communicating and presenting to a live audience, as well counting towards your continuing professional development.

Who can enter?

The competition is open to members and non-members of the NI who are under the age of 37 at the time of the competition.



How do I enter?

All you have to do at this stage is submit a **title**, a **200-word synopsis** and the details requested below. The synopsis will give the judges a flavour of what to expect from your presentation. The best 6 synopses, as judged by the organising committee, will be invited to present on the 29th June.
