The Nuclear Institute branch and network structure

YGN

WiN UK

Providing mentoring and training opportunities for women working in the nuclear industry, WiN UK works to promote diversity across the sector and improve the representation of women in leadership. WiN UK is run by volunteers and frequently engages with the public on nuclear issues.
