The T&Cs:

- All entrants must be in KS4 (Year 10 and 11) or KS5 (Year 12 and 13, or in an apprenticeship at the same level) at the time of entry.
- Please ask your parents or guardian's permission before entering.
- All entries must be received by midnight on Sunday 10th January. If your entry is received after this, it will not be counted. Entries must be submitted by email to niygcumbria@gmail.com or to our Dropbox with both your entry as an attachment and your application details filled into the table above. You must provide all of the information in the table or your entry will not be counted.
- Entries may be in the form of:
 - a 'back-of-a-book' summary (max 200 words)
 - a poster (max size A3)
 - or a video (max 3 minutes)
- If you choose to submit a poster or 'back of a book' summary, we recommend submitting it as both the original file (i.e. a Microsoft word document) and as pdf version, as pdf documents are compatible with all computers. For video files, please use either AVI or MP4.
- Please do not use any media that you do not have permission to use. You can limit search engine results to only return results that are available for reuse. With Google, you can do this by selecting settings, advanced search, and selecting from the usage rights drop down menu. You can then enter your search query in the 'Find pages with' section.
- If successful, the entrant agrees to present at the National College for Nuclear (Lakes college campus) 17:30-20:00 on Thursday 30th January. If you are unable to attend, please contact niygcumbria@gmail.com to let us know.
- The finalists will be informed by Thursday 23rd January, via the email address you used to submit your entry.
- You may reuse content from your entry for your presentation.
